### MIDDLE AGE TRAINING - BAGUIO 2024

Event: MIDDLE-AGE TRAINING (MAT-15), Module 1

Training Dates: April 1 to 13, 2024

Venue: Blending Hall, Church in Baguio

Objective of the MAT:

That the middle-aged saints may be perfected and raised-up in the present age for the Lord's testimony, for the furtherance of the gospel and for the service in the building up of the Body of Christ.

Dear saints,

The Middle Age Training (MAT) – LIVE will resume on April 1-13, 2024 at the Blending Hall of the church in Baguio City, 111 Tacay Road, Pinsao Proper, Baguio City. This will cover Module 1 of the four modules of the MAT curriculum.

For reference, the MAT Online (Mod.1) will be on August 2024 until January 2025. The live training and the online training modules are credited likewise. This advisory is particularly intended for the 'live/in-person training' only. Separate advisory will be announced later for the online training.

For this term, priority is given to those who are graduating in module 1, particularly those who have not yet experienced the live/in-person training.

To apply for the upcoming module of the MAT, please follow the guidelines below.

### **Guidelines for Participation:**

### I. Qualifications:

- A. At least six months with church life and recommended by the elders of the church.
- B. 30 to 65 years old and of good health.
- C. Loving the Lord and consecrated to complete the training.
- D. Able to understand English language. Lessons are delivered in English.
- E. Able to cope with the daily living schedule and cooperate with the training teams.
- F. Willing to share the gospel and shepherd the new ones in-person.
- G. Accepted by the MAT Registration Department

# II. Application for Training:

- A. Applicants must fully accomplish the online 'Application & Consecration Form' available in the website <a href="https://mat.fttmalabon.org">https://mat.fttmalabon.org</a>. These shall be validated and affirmed by the co-worker for the province/region or by an elder of the local church where the applicant is having his church life. For foreign trainees, the approval by the elder of their locality is required.
- B. During the application period, trainees must submit **chest x-ray results** taken within the year 2024. **X-ray films** must be presented to the MAT medical office during check-in. Trainees with known medical conditions, (ex.: heart ailments, disabilities, unstable BP, etc.), must submit **medical records and doctor's clearance** before check-in and bring their own medicine for the two weeks duration of the training.
- C. The Training Donation is PHP6,000 for the local saints, and USD200 for the saints from overseas. This will cover meals and lodging at the Blending Hall for two weeks. Local trainees must pay at least PHP2,000 before the registration deadline to be considered registered. For

- **cancellations** made after March 15, 2024, the training will no longer refund the registration fee in full, but will charge P1,000 to cover for the administrative expenses.
- D. Trainees must attend all classes and activities **without miss**. All trainees must follow strictly the daily living schedule. Tardiness and absences to the classes and activities may may require rendering make-up classes to complete the records. Habitual lapses may disqualify the trainee from being admitted to join the next term of MAT.
- E. The forms shall be **accomplished online** and the donation and other fees deposited directly to the bank account indicated below.
- F. **Deadline for registration** is on **February 26, 2024.** All forms and fees must be received by the registration service on or before that date. Late registrants may be allowed on a case-to-case basis but with an additional 50% on the donation fee. Admission is not guaranteed for late registrants, and admission is limited by the accommodation capacity of the training venue which is now set at 200 persons.
- G. **All payments** must be forwarded to the FTT-Malabon Training Center in Malabon *c/o Sis. Jennilyn Su*, or deposited to the following account:

Trainees from overseas may request to pay their USD donation fee upon check in. However, they must submit their confirmed flight details to assure their participation.

# III. Accommodation and Transportation

- A. Accommodation for the trainees is available at the Blending Hall. Should a trainee prefer to stay in a hotel, he/she should make their own bookings and payments. Outside accommodation is allowed as long as the trainee can report to the training venue five minutes before the schedule that starts at 5:55am daily. For those who want to book outside accommodations, we recommend staying at a nearby location in order to save travel time between training schedules and preparation/rest times.
- B. **Optional chartered bus** from Malabon to Baguio and/or back (inclusive of light meals) can be reserved on a first-come-first-serve basis at a full fee of **P2,000** (or **P1000 one way).** A non-refundable reservation fee of P500 must be paid upon registration, and the remaining amount may be paid upon check-in. The bus will board by **1:00pm on March 31, 2024**.

# IV. Check-in Time for Training:

- A. The check-in time is from March 31, 6:00pm to April 1, 10:00am at the Blending Hall of the church in Baguio at 111 Tacay Road, Pinsao Proper, Baguio City. Trainees are advised to arrive earlier to register for accommodation and take sufficient rest before the start of the session.
- B. The training orientation session will start by 10:00am on April 1, and first training session will start immediately by 10:30am.
- C. Arrivals before March 31: Please arrange your own accommodations and meals. Accommodations for MAT participants at the Blending Hall will only be available on the night of March 31, 2024. Meals will be served starting April 1, 2024.

### V. Important Schedules to Remember:

March 31 - Chartered bus trip to Baguio, 12:30pm assembly and boarding

**April 1-13** – Training Proper

April 13 - Graduation Meeting, Middle Age Training - Baguio, 10:30am - 12:00nn

April 13 – Chartered bus return trip to Malabon, 2:30pm

# VI. Preparation for the Trainees:

- A. Trainees must prepare themselves spiritually and physically as the training routines can be strenuous.
- B. Be guided by the **'Things to Bring'** checklist. Secure all basic necessities before check in for training.
- C. The Training has a dress code during sessions:
  - For Brothers: Dark slacks, white long sleeves polo, necktie and dark leather closed shoes with dark long socks. Dark formal coat is recommended. No rugged jacket. No denims. No loud colors.
  - 2. For **Sisters:** Dark skirt, white blouse, bow tie, head covering and closed dark leather shoes. Dark formal vest is recommended. No mini-skirt. No ladies denims. No loud colors.
    - \*\*\*For the daily physical exercise, all trainees need to wear jogging pants, white T-shirt and rubber shoes with thick socks. Bring your own water bottle.
- D. Meetings are conducted mainly in English with FM radio translation to Tagalog. Messages delivered in Tagalog or Chinese have radio translation in English. For radio translation, please bring your own headset and FM receiver or FM-capable cell phone.
- E. Trainees coming for the first time are recommended to fellowship with former MAT trainees for insight.
- F. MAT activities are highly regulated. Observe the general rules and be ready to comply.
- G. Trainees are advised to bring some cash allowance for their minor expenditures, i.e.: printed training materials, recommended books, laundry, sundries, medicine, etc.
- H. Avoid bringing valuables and large amount of cash.
- I. Plan your trip. Arrange for your transportation ahead of time in a way that does not conflict with training activities. As a matter of spiritual preparation, trainees are recommended to join the preceding Fellowship Among Churches (FAC) in Malabon on March 29-31, 2024. Details concerning FAC is available at lr-ph.org.

### VII. Preparation for the Training Proper:

- A. Trainees must attend all daily schedules and complete all sessions and activities. No sit in, no part time attendees.
- B. Cell phones and gadgets must be set to silent mode during sessions, nap time and sleeping time.
- C. Trainees must be seated in the training hall five (5) minutes before the start of every session.
- D. Trainees need to function by praying, singing and prophesying and to uplift the spiritual atmosphere.
- E. Always bring Bible, Hymns, outline, pen and notebook, and FM headset in the meetings.
- F. All trainees must participate in the group activities, specific instructions and practical services.
- G. Group pursuit, testing and gospel preaching form part of the MAT. All trainees are expected to participate and exercise their spirit for the building up of one another in harmony.
- H. Be healthy and fit for the intensive training. Exercise the mingled spirit all the time. Enjoy the Lord.

### THINGS TO BRING FOR THE TRAINING

### For the Meeting:

- 1. RcV Bible (Old and New Testament)
- 2. Hymnal
- 3. Notebook, Pen, highlighter pen
- 4. Holy Word for Morning Revival
- 5. FM Radio (optional for language translation)
- 6. Meeting Bag (black/dark colored)

# For Gospel Preaching:

- 1. Mystery of Human Life
- 2. Umbrella/Raincoat
- 3. Gospel Tracts

### For Accommodation:

- 1. Blanket, 2 pillow cases
- 2. Hangers, laundry bags
- 3. Personal Medication
- 4. Bath towel and hand towel
- 5. Toiletries: bath soap, laundry soap, toothpaste, etc.
- 6. Slippers (for room and for shower)
- 7. Pajamas (short pants -not encouraged for sisters)
- 8. Light colored shirts

### Morning Attire:

- 9. Coat or semi-formal jacket (optional)
- 10. Reading glass (as needed)

### Sisters:

- 1. Blouse w/ collar: Long/short sleeves, white
- 2. Head Covering, bow tie
- 3. Skirt: black/dark color
- 4. Sandos (undershirts), brasseries
- 5. Underwear, black pantylet or tight short
- 6. Stockings (recommended)
- 7. Leather shoes: black/dark, closed, low cut
- 8. Handkerchief
- 9. Coat or vest
- 10. Reading glass (as needed)

# IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

- 1. Limit the number of bags/luggage to two (2) because of limited space at the quarters.
- 2. The Blending Hall does **NOT** have laundry facilities for trainees. **Laundry service** is available outside for a fee.
- 3. Bring valid ID / Senior Citizen Card / Doctor's Prescription ready for reference in case of emergency.
- 4. Bring medical and chest x-ray record of the last 6 months when coming to the MAT.
